SUBJECT: Low Performing Student Block Grant

The California Department of Education (CDE) will allocate Low Performing Student Block Grant funds during the 2018–19 fiscal year (FY) to eligible local educational agencies (LEAs), which include school districts, county offices of education (COEs), and charter schools that serve pupils identified as low-performing on state English language arts or mathematics assessments and who are not otherwise identified for supplemental grant funding under the Local Control Funding Formula or eligible for special education services.

Each LEA will receive an equal amount per eligible pupil.
Funds are available for expenditure or encumbrance through the 2020–21
